

# LEAD SERVICE LINE MATERIAL INVENTORY

Before implementing a lead service line replacement program, communities should finalize a policy that outlines the financial responsibilities for both the municipality and the property owner.

## ACT\* HIGHLIGHTS

- When using state or federal funding, municipalities must fund the entire cost of LSLR.
- If the municipality uses its own funds for LSLR, it can require the property owner to fund the replacement of the private portion of the service line.
- If choosing to require property owners to pay, communities should consider options for structuring payments between the utility and the customer over time.
